

BETTING






International Betting on Ice Hockey

3 betting rules:



- 1. To bet on ANY ice hockey games
- 2. To help someone with betting on ice hockey games
- 3. When participating in a multi-sport event, to bet on any of the sports of that event (Olympic Games)




SHARING OF INSIDER INFORMATION





Insider Information





To place bets, information is key.

Team tactics or health issues are inside information that could be used for betting purposes.

Make sure inside information stays private. Be cautious on social media!

REPORTING

IIHF Code of Conduct:



- Don't bet on ice hockey, and if you are a player at a multi-sport event, do not bet on any other sport in the event;
- Never manipulate a competition and always do your best;
- Don't share insider information (nonpublic information); and
- Report as not reporting is also wrong.

How can manipulators approach you?







Creates a feeling of obligation

Direct approach (proposing gift, money)

Indirect approach (through family, friend, team)

Become friends Creating a bond, grooming

Identify weaknesses
Age / Income / Gambling



First manipulation

Often small and a first step towards more serious offences



Threats

When the target wants to quit or does not cooperate

YOU ARE CAUGHT IN A VICIOUS CIRCLE



Who can be approached?





EXTERNAL PEOPLE:

Friends, retired athletes, family, sponsors, criminals

Direct influence on the competition:

- Athletes
- Referees
- Judges

INTERNAL PEOPLE:

Coaches, managers, agents, club owners, players, competition organisers.


